

WHY IIT BHU?

Old IIT

Although it got the IIT status in 2012 the institute is in no way a new one. Founded in 1919 as the Banaras Engineering College, it became the Institute of Technology, Banaras Hindu University in 1968. It has been admitting students through IIT-JEE since 1972. It was designated an Indian Institute of Technology status in 2012. IIT (BHU) Varanasi boasts of 14 departments and 3 inter-disciplinary schools. It is one of the oldest engineering institutes in India which brought up electrical, mechanical, ceramic, and pharmaceutical engineering in India. And it has always succeeded to stand with the other old IITs even when it wasn't one. From placement records to a well-established student culture one can expect all the perks and facilities like those of the old IITs.

Campus Life:

IIT (BHU) Varanasi boasts of one of the best campus life one can ever get in an Indian university. Situated inside a 1300-acre beautiful campus of Banaras Hindu University the buildings of the institute were built in the first half of the 20th century and are fine examples of Indo-Gothic architecture which is a unique aspect due to the grandeur and unique architectural elegance that they offer. Whether it's the beautiful greenery, picturesque horizon or early morning strolls to the temple you name it, and the campus offers it.

A plethora of activities are organized under IIT Gymkhana by the students, right from the beginning of each semester. More than 24 clubs function within the campus under 5 councils which provide ample opportunities for students to learn and innovate as well as help them in improving their personalities. The Students' Parliament is also there which is the highest representative body of students in the Institute. It serves as a critical link between the students and the Institute administration, acting like a feedback system in policy matters via various standing committees. The role of the Students' Parliament is to discuss matters of student welfare and interest and initiate proposals related to the general body for implementation by the Institute through the Dean of Students' Affairs.

The whole gamut of fests involves three extravaganzas in the form of the KashiYatra – Annual Socio-Cultural Festival, Spardha – Annual Sports Festival, and Technex – Asia's oldest

Techno-Management Festival aside from the many departmental fests, conferences & seminars. The fests attract ample crowds from universities across India, to witness the awesome display of talent by the IIT (BHU) Varanasi student fraternity inspired by the lifestyle of the holy city. These add up to a pretty gargantuan figure, testifying to the fact that academic aside. Spacious grounds and fields provide voluptuous opportunities for sports like Cricket & Football. Other sports like Badminton, Tennis are played with equal participation and enthusiasm. Besides, the institute has a well-furnished Technology Business Incubator and CISCO ThingQbator for budding entrepreneurs within the institute.

The city of Varanasi in itself is amazingly vivid in terms of its culture. In due course of time, the mystical intricacies of the city cast a spell on your senses and one falls in love with the crowded streets, narrow gullies, the nocturnal deafening & deadly silence of the ghats, the distant chiming of the temple bells, the psychedelic concerts by stoned foreigners, the delicacies of roadside chat and what not. Alumni

Well, IIT(BHU) has a 100-year-long intriguing history. It was spread over the BHU campus into different departments which came together as the Institute of Technology and later as the Indian Institute of Technology in 2012.

1. The biggest factor is the number. IIT(BHU) might have become an IIT in 2012, but engineering students have been graduating from here since 1919. A whole 100-year history. If we take the average of 600 students per year(as of today 1200 come in every year and initially 100-200 used to come) it sums up to 60,000 Engineering professionals so far, resting aside their families, their professional contacts, and the number of resources they can provide. In the recently culminated CENTENARY CELEBRATION and GLOBAL ALUMNI MEET 2019, Mr. Jinendra Jain was an alumnus who completed 100 years with the institute in 2019 as well.
2. The beauty of IIT(BHU) and Varanasi can be seen in the attachment Alumni have for the institute and the city. SAIC was established in 2015, 3 years after it became an IIT. However realizing the common ground of attachment for their alma mater, Alumni had themselves come forward and today IIT(BHU) has 4 strong, gigantic, and enthusiastic Alumni associations. We can clearly see how widespread the alumni community of IIT BHU is. Its spread geographically makes it all the more resourceful as alumni can then provide experiences of professional lives in various countries, as also help students realize their foreign country dreams by guiding and mentoring them. 3. SAIC in collaboration with the Alumni Community has undertaken various initiatives for the betterment of students and the institute
 - a) Monetary support for infrastructural development, the establishment of ThinQbator, Funding for fests, for construction of advanced laboratories, halls, lecture theaters, hostels etc have been done time and again by Alumni.  - c) Regular donations by the 4 Alumni associations and from alumni independently too, providing opportunities for undertaking projects, conducting workshops, lectures, and taking courses (everything coordinated by SAIC) constantly helps inspire students and gives them more real-world exposure.
4. The Student Alumni Interaction Cell of IIT (BHU) – website link is in its young days right now. There is active participation of students and more and more interaction. The year 2020 will be the closing year of Centenary Celebrations expected to end with joy, happiness, and constructive vision for the institute for the next 100 years. Another good thing about SAIC is that students here are the ones who feel really connected to their Alumni. There is no room for someone who is working for some perks or benefits as SAIC doesn't garner awards, but it brings happiness looking at families interact with each other and feeling satisfied and content every time they come to the institute.

The IIT (BHU) Global Alumni Association (IBGAA) is the official alumni association with Chapters present worldwide. It is the largest alumni association among all of the IITs and is very active and ever-ready to help the juniors achieve new heights.

Coding Culture

IIT(BHU) boasts of an excellent coding culture. We have a club of programmers (COPS) which promotes and supports coding culture in our college. Students from our college repeatedly make it to the regional championships of the premiere Inter-Collegiate Programming Championship (ICPC), and last year, a team from IIT(BHU) also qualified for the World Finals, where they would represent India! Students from IIT(BHU) excel in Competitive Programming, with many students among the top 50 in India (according to CodeForces rankings). In a recent display of our coding prowess, two IIT(BHU) students grabbed the All India Rank 1 and 2 in a CodeChef contest, beating thousands of college students. In 2023, Inter IIT Tech Meet 11.0, we won 5 medals, and we were in the top 10 in overall standings, last year, i.e., Inter IIT Tech Meet 10.0, we won 5 medals, and we got overall 6th position. Students perform well through perfect guidance from respective clubs in events like GSoC, SoB, and LFX. In GSoC, this year, 16 students got selected, and last year 24 got selected. In SoB, this year and the previous year 3 students got selected. In LFX, this year 4 students have been selected till now

Entrepreneurship opportunities

IIT BHU has a diverse and flourishing startup culture – be it exports, travel, education or for the welfare of the general public. Successful startups of IIT BHU alumni like Zostel, Zest money, Shopclues, Cricbuzz, Motion IIT JEE, etc. have disrupted various sectors. In addition to this, there exists a student body known as the E-Cell, IIT BHU which acts as the bridge between the students and the business world. E-Cell's goal is to nurture startups and instill an entrepreneurial mindset among the students. A vast alumnus network also catalyzes the startup culture by providing exposure and guidance to hit on the land of unicorns.

There is an on-campus Technology Business Incubator, the Malviya Centre for Innovation, Incubation and Entrepreneurship (MCIIE), which has been running since 2008. In addition, Cisco Nasscom has established its ThingQbator Spaces inside the campus to give direction to potential startups by providing workspace, hardware equipment and much-needed mentorship. MCIIE and Cisco ThinQbator connect to the student community via E-Cell, IIT BHU.

Other than this, E-Cell also organizes events like Start-up Weekend, Hult Prize and Startup Fair which provides students with a platform to pitch their ideas in front of eminent personalities of the corporate world.

In a nutshell, IIT BHU has been quite successful in producing the best entrepreneurs of the

country and E-Cell, IIT BHU is working towards the provision of opportunity with viable resources to the budding startups.

Course Structure

The institute has a brand-new academic curriculum that weaves research and innovation with flexible coursework. The flexibility so provided in the curriculum can be used by the keen learner to his/her advantage. It provides opportunities to students to take up project work at various stages of the undergraduate program. Besides the B.Tech. project in the final year, the student also does an exploratory project in 2nd year. There is also an option to take upstream projects over four semesters in 3rd year and 4th years.

The curriculum permits even undergraduate students to take courses and do research across departments and disciplines.


Placements

Hi, I am Eshaan Gupta. I am pursuing B. Tech in Electronics Engineering at IIT (BHU), Varanasi. Last year, when I joined the college as a fresher, I had opted for Chemical Engineering. At my rank, that was the best possible option available to me. I actually upgraded my program from Chemical to Electronics at the end of the first semester. This is one of the many awesome opportunities that an IIT offers you. I would like to share my experience of changing my department.

Department change or Branch Change is something that most freshies are desperate about. Almost all of the people want to get their branches upgraded. Well, I was no different, to be honest. It was not like I was not satisfied with Chemical Engineering. Chemical Engineering is one of the best and the oldest branches at IIT BHU. But I knew that upgrading my branch to a circuitual one, would definitely open a lot more opportunities for me, especially because circuitual branches are more popular. Also, I learned that some top companies like Microsoft and Amazon open up only for circuitual branches when these mega-companies come for campus recruitment. Also, non-core off-campus placement is quite difficult, considering the amount of competition. Thus, I realized that if I get my department changed, that would put me in a better place.

Regular and serious study is crucial for preparing for JEE exams. One should attend classes regularly and understand the professors and TAs to achieve this. Despite not attending the library in the first semester, one can still achieve department changes by practicing cricket, making a semi-autonomous robot, and a telescope. Tutors and assignments are sufficient for practicing concepts learned in lectures, and staying focused until the end can lead to department changes. Freshers often seek department changes, but those who stay focused and persistent can achieve their desired results.

So, at the end of first semester, I got a good CPI, which allowed me to change my branch to Electronics engineering. Actually, I missed Computer Science by 0.01 CPI. (I scored 9.94, and CSE was available at 9.95 and above). Well, this thing didn't sadden me. I was happy that I now have more opportunities available during campus placements. The courses that are a part of the electronics engineering curriculum also seem interesting to me. After getting my branch changed, the next semester, I continued practicing cricket, even making up to the senior team which was set to represent IIT BHU at sportech'20. The next semester, I was quite chilled out, now that I had my department changed. I enjoyed the campus life, the fests and many other things.

Thus, regular efforts powered with continued focus, would definitely help you to get your department changed. It's not that difficult.

2. Technex




EVENTS
