Online Faculty Development Programme on **LIFE SKILLS FOR EDUCATORS**

2–6 November 2020

Overview

There is a growing awareness of the rapidly changing social, economic, and political structures among educators. Simultaneously, there is also a growing need to keep pace with demands and challenges caused by these transformations. Realising this need for sustainable upskilling, UNICEF, UNESCO and WHO have listed the ten core life skill strategies and techniques that need to be acquired by individuals in order to guide learners cope with their existential concerns with ease and grace. There is also the need to enable learners to be confident about their thinking skills, interpersonal skills, and emotional skills leading to their holistic development.

This programme has been designed to introduce participants to a group of research skills, psychosocial and interpersonal skills, and digital skills in an experiential setting with a view to developing in them the requisite capacity for optimal performance. The core life skills included in the programme are essentially those skills that help develop competence and promote mental wellbeing among participants and prepare them for the challenges of personal and professional life.

The programme contents will be delivered not through the traditional “information based” approach, but through an “experiential and situational” approach. The delivery approach will be customised to address behaviour change through changes in information processing and attitude.
